Shower

I undertook to correct problems with our shower, which  
has leaked for many years. The metal sheathing at the base  
was rusted mostly in front leading me to believe the major

leakage occurs in the front around the door. Accordingly I removed the rusted strip from the front and found the cement base was deteriorating at an alarming rate. Indeed, I found cracking occurring at both corners inside the shower at the front.

I bought "waterplug" expanding leak-stopping cement and patched the outside <sup>INSIDE</sup> eroded areas. It sets in a few minutes. I bought muretic acid and thoroughly etched the shower floor. I then caulked along the bottom and edges where leakage could conceivably occur, and then painted. I used a piece of hardboard paneling that Greg Haldor gave me to replace the front base strip.

8/20/89. We have used the shower for several days now and I've noticed no dampness along the base board in back. I hope this solves that problem. (WIAA?)

The Interlochen Public radio station on 88.3 FM plays a variety of classical music throughout the day. It is beautiful and calming.

The ceiling fan is really nice. It not only looks good and appropriate for the cottage, but cools the whole cottage when used in conjunction with a window fan blowing into the living room area.

Arrived late Sat. night to a new landmark for spotting the cottage from the road. Apparently a Z-28 wrapped itself around the pine tree on the corner of our lot and stripped the bark. No one was seriously injured. Better the tree than the bathhouse.

We spent a whole day hopping around Charlevoix. Lot of people and activity going on for the 4<sup>th</sup>. Also went out to the Bear Pines on another day. I recommend the scenic drive very highly. They have made great strides as far as improving the lookout points and paving the road. Overall a great time.

On the 4<sup>th</sup>, we stayed around the cottage most of the day. We did get to boat over to Deepwater Point and party down at the River. Saw the fireworks up at C-h. From the boat. Aug. 23-30 1990 Copy Mary Kelly Harvey and Danny.

We drove through the night arriving at 2:45 AM on Thurs. 8/23/90. The cottage was spotless, showing the love we all have for this place. I forgot my key and drove back to Marjorie's place from Hinderley - we couldn't find Marjorie's key, so I called Smitty and he had one. And so, we got in without burglar tools ---

The Holdas, Greg, Coral and 4 girls were here at Greenes and the kids got to play with them for one day. They left Friday. Tom Greenes new boat has a 120 hp. engine, and the engine is a 153<sup>CP</sup> Chevy II engine. - boy, does it haul ass! It was good to see them all.

The shower seems to be holding up well. I always thought, and still do, that the moisture along the baseboard was from the toilet tank sweating. If someone can figure out how to stop that we may save that baseboard.

I only had a week, and the only thing I worked on was the heater, which would not work when I got here. I unhooked the line at both ends and blew out a bunch of crap - soot, insects, etc. I also ended up cleaning out the flue pipes, which had many years of accumulated soot in them. That was a hoot. I tried to move the heater a little, and the pipe came out on the back. Anyway, I got it all back together. I scraped all the soot and scale off of the burner and reamed out the inlet line. It works good now.

I lost the "knee board." It came off from the tow lip and vanished. I'm real sorry. I thought it would float and I searched and searched. I dived to find it, but to no avail. It is gone with the wind and I regret it.

The new brass lamps are wonderful. What an improvement over those little gun bastards! The window frames look much better too.

We went to Traverse City to the Clinch Park Zoo, and do you know what? There is no beaver there. I asked about it, and they said that beavers pine away and die if they can't do stuff, building dams, etc. However, there is a common crow that says, "Eat shit! Eat shit!" The otters were a hoot though. The train has a real oil-fired steam engine. I can't get over that.

Everyone was in good health and the weather was gorgeous. We had days when it was 95°, and it was in the 90's everyday. It was real quiet too - town was deserted until we were about to leave. -Labor day last hurrah close-up-the-cottage people.

Sat. June 1<sup>st</sup> - Beautiful day - 90° - (We haven't had this high of temp. in 20 years of being here. The fans do help alot.)

Meter - 57.8 1/2 - Rt Pet Tank in use

Arrived 2<sup>30</sup> PM Sunny day - blue skies - grass is knee high - Cottage opened without a hitch. Weeping willow tree lost a couple large limbs - top of old dead tree by beach came down - many limbs in front yard. We got the sticks picked up on Sat + planned to mow grass Sun - Well you guessed it, it rained cats + dogs all night - Right now we are looking out the window + watching it rain (usually what we do the day after we arrive)

Sun - 11:30 AM It cleared up, Len got the grass mowed + I cut off as much weeping willow limbs <sup>as possible</sup> without a ladder. The place looks presentable now. Front shrubs trimmed. I found many lady slipper (wild flowers) in yard + transplanted them up by house so they don't get mowed. All in all it was a wonderful day + half here. We brought the boat battery + boat wax etc. with us. - wish we had time to get dock out + launch boat, but maybe Len will get a boat ride some year.

Mon. June 3<sup>rd</sup> Left about 7<sup>00</sup> AM Had a wonderful time - Zig did too.

Sat. June 29 → Wed July 10 John + Sara, Dave + Alberta Gibson.

We arrived here to hot, humid day well into the 90's. It has been extremely dry up here and most of the grass was brown. In fact, the last rain they got was the day Mom + Dad wrote about above. The cottage was in beautiful shape and the grass had slightly grown. It finally rained on Mon. → Wed. on and off and was overcast most of that time. This cooled down the temp and kept it in the 70's at day and 50/60's at night - Nice. We put up the dock and launched the boat with no problems. The boat is running in top form and should continue to do so. I cut down the dead tree in front of the beach and rolled the log along the tree line. I would of cut it up, but the chainsaw I had was a smaller model. I trimmed the limbs off of 5 pine trees while I was on a roll. I quit when the stack of limbs was beyond my reach. It looks nice with the extra space

under the trees and plan to get to the other trees in future visits. The weeping willow looked like it had broken down some more with some major limbs sagging to the ground. I did what I could (without reducing it to a twig).
