Sizzie - We have had a great time, I got a bike at a yard sale for 10.00 and put a tire & tube on the front. It's a really nice girls bike, much easier without the bar to hurt you. It's great that four people can bike ride. Well, I got up on the knee board on about the third try. It's really hard on your arms, but, you can spin backwards once you're going. It was fun, my arms weren't strong enough to do it very long. Skiing is much easier. The girls tried the tube but, it seems to sink. It won't skim the water like all the other 3000 tubes on the lake. (I think they have bottoms) The front dips and gives them big face fulls of water. Needless to say, they are afraid to do it.

We used all the boats except the canoe, I sailed across the lake two times, the girls rowed the row boat a lot. I painted the bench seats of the row boat with 3 coats of urethane; they were very thirsty. Mom was always busy doing something and I sort of followed her cue. We really got a lot done around here. The Seagull is Capt. Poopy, lots of swans, deer, wild turkeys, racoons, ducks - we saw it all & loved it.


