But Joe knows construction, and what he built is immensely better than the old one. He braced the corners with angle iron. He used 2 part epoxy paint to coat the barrels. He knew where to get the best prices on materials. He built it at home, dis-assembled it, brought it up and re-built it.

We had to make one trip into Petoskey to get things we didn't have specs for - like the cable.

Finished Monday night.

Quite honestly - if I'd know how much work he had to put into it - I never would have asked him to do it.

also: Decking is a product made from re-cycled plastic made to look like wood - I will never split, rot, splinter or twist.
