Friday June 5<sup>th</sup>

Arrived at 2:00 pm to beautiful blue skies + 85° temp, what a change from rain drenched Ohio. When we pulled in, a couple fellows in a bass boat were catching a big walleye in front of the cottage (Keith there must be 5 or 6 waiting for you) The mosquitoes + black flies are fierce, you can't be out without insect repellent, even Lucy. We rented a plane twice + flew all over, it was beautiful! I took a lot of pictures, Mackinac Bridge from the air is impressive. I bought another lamp (Yellow base) just need to find a shade for it. We didn't get to any garage sales to find it.

The left propane tank (the one in service) is almost empty. I ordered a replacement on Thur, June 5<sup>th</sup>, it will be delivered on Thur June 12<sup>th</sup>. Just use left tank until it runs out + switch to right tank, which is full (I had it tank replaced last fall because it was leaking, they came out the same day & replaced it)

We left for home on Friday June 6<sup>th</sup>, looking forward to Jessica + Keith's wedding on Saturday.

We've gone bike riding to both Central Lake and Bellaire, lots of swimming (especially to the swimming dock), played catch, watched some movies (my dad brought a VCR), gone to Brownwood, had a bonfire; and lots of great food.
